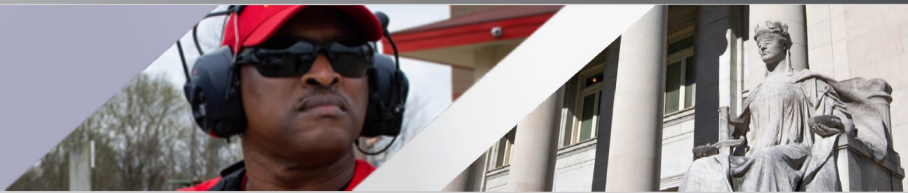

- Auto Theft Task Force
- Gun Crimes Unit
- Proposal for new Community Impact Officers (CIOs)-Rehire 50 Retired Officers for community engagement and operational support

# INSPECTIONAL SERVICES

Inspectional Services is made up of the Internal Affairs Squad and the Security Squad. Inspectional Services conducts all internal investigations involving police personnel, as well as other sensitive investigations. Officers assigned to these units are appointed by the Chief of Police and are considered to be highly experienced investigators. In 1996, the offices of Internal Affairs and Security Squad were relocated to the 100 North Main building, Suite 2220, in downtown Memphis. In December of 2006, IAB and Security Squad were moved once again to the corner of Poplar and Union Extended.

## Purpose of Internal Affairs

The purpose of the Internal Affairs Squad is to define responsibilities and establish procedures for sworn members of this department for dealing with observed or reported allegations of misconduct. Internal Affairs investigates all complaints lodged against police personnel. These complaints can range from verbal abuse to brutality. The majority of these complaints fall under three categories: Personal Conduct, Use of Force and Arrest, and Duty Performance.

## Purpose of Security Squad

The Security Squad investigates all shooting incidents involving police officers and any complaints regarding possible criminal misconduct against employees. These investigations include accusations against officers, city employees from various departments, and other administrative investigations. The Security Squad is also responsible for teaching Deadly Force lectures at the Training Academy for new police recruits and during In-Service Training for veteran officers. Their Deadly Force lecture is also part of the training received by all citizens enrolled in the Citizen's Police Academy.

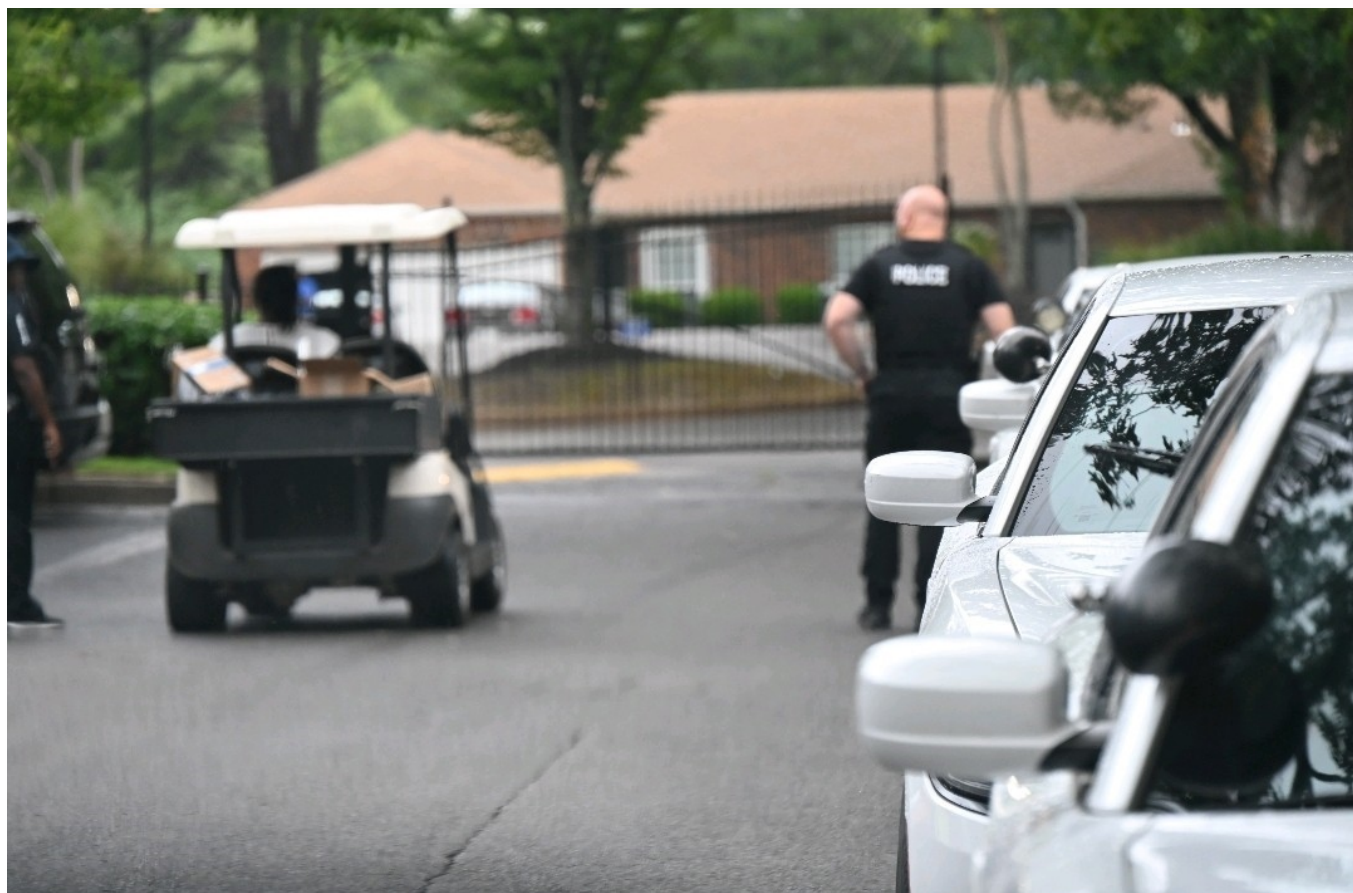

# INVESTIGATIVE SERVICES

**The Investigative Services branch of the Memphis Police Department is responsible for thoroughly reviewing the details surrounding every crime committed in Memphis. Investigative Services works closely with all branches of the Memphis Police Department and other law enforcement agencies to solve crime.**

## **Crime Scene Investigation**

The Crime Scene Investigation Unit is a full-time operational unit responsible for conducting on-site investigations at the scenes of violent crimes (homicides, sex crimes, robberies, aggravated assaults, and missing persons) and property crimes (burglaries, auto thefts, and thefts or destruction of property over \$10,000). CSI also handles any follow-up investigative requests for which CSI services are needed to process, collect, preserve, package, transport, analyze, and document physical and/or trace evidence that will assist in the successful investigation and prosecution of offenders committing crimes in Memphis. CSI is a support unit to all bureaus within Investigative Services and provides training to regional law enforcement personnel in the area of crime scene investigations. In 2021, CSI responded to 4,279 radio calls, initiated 16,103 specials, handled 4,686 scenes, and processed 2,643 vehicles. CSI also participated in 13 civic presentations and facilitated numerous training events for regional law enforcement agencies.

## **Domestic Violence**

The Domestic Violence Unit (DV) investigates domestic violence incidents. The DV Unit works closely with the Citizen's Dispute Office and the Shelby County Sheriff's Office regarding Domestic Violence warrants and protective orders. In 2021, the DV Unit reviewed 16,495 cases, including 2,214 aggravated assaults and 7,945 simple assaults.

## **Economic Crimes**

The Economic Crimes Bureau is responsible for investigating and prosecuting individuals involved in felony crimes. Crimes investigated include forgeries, counterfeit checks, credit and debit cards, computer fraud, insurance fraud, and other forms of financial institution fraud. In 2021, Economic Crime Investigators handled 3,764 cases, made 274 total arrests and had an 18.5% clearance rate.

## **Felony Response**

Felony Response handles preliminary investigations involving felonies that occur between the hours of 4 pm and 8 am. Offenses investigated include rape, homicide, robbery, burglary, and larceny. In 2021, Felony Response handled 5,127 calls, 4,088 investigations, and 1,920 arrests.

## **Homicide**

The Homicide Bureau is responsible for conducting all investigations related to homicides, suicides, and natural or accidental deaths. Memphis recorded 345 homicides in 2021 compared to 332 in 2020. The Homicide Bureau was able to clear 66% of all homicides in 2021 while the national average is 50%. Homicide also made 106 arrests and investigated 4,099 cases.

# INVESTIGATIVE SERVICES

## Missing Persons

The Missing Persons Bureau investigated 3,544 total missing persons cases. This number includes 895 Missing Person cases, 1,612 Runaway cases, 396 Custodial Interferences cases, and 641 memos. Investigators were able to clear 2,294 of the total 3,544 missing persons cases giving the unit a 79% clearance rate.

## Pawn/Scrap/Seizure

The Pawn, Scrap, Seizure Unit investigates person(s) responsible for thefts of scrap metals, monitors and identifies frequent pawners, recovers stolen property, assists outside agencies, and assists investigators in creating a deterrent for criminals by seizing vehicles that were used in the conveyance of felony crimes. Pawn, Scrap, Seizure Unit handled 131 assigned scrap cases, 104 pawn pickups, 326 items seized at value of \$134,273, and made 11 arrests during 2021.

## Property and Evidence

Memphis Police Department Property and Evidence is operated 24 hours daily. Property and Evidence is responsible for logging and storing thousands of pieces of property that come into the possession of UAPD each year. Property may be classified as evidence connected with case investigations, search warrants, or seized as contraband. In 2021, the unit issued 28,088 evidence numbers, tagged 103,550 items, and released 5,731 items to authorized persons.

## Quality Assurance Unit

The mission of the Quality Assurance Unit is to effectively review and properly classify memos, review unfounded and exceptionally cleared incidents, and assist bureaus with report validation. They also ensure that The Memphis Police Department is properly reporting incidents under TIBRS and NIBRS standards. The Quality Assurance Unit reviewed, verified, and or corrected 16,477 TIBRS errors in 2021.

## Sex Crimes/Juvenile Abuse

This unit is responsible for handling investigations involving any sexual or physically abusive crime. In 2021, the Sex Crimes/Juvenile Abuse Squad reviewed 1,366 total cases which included 268 rapes, 126 occurrences of forcible fondling, and 113 stalking complaints with 626 arrests.

## Vehicle Storage

The City of Memphis Vehicle Storage is located at 465 Klinke Avenue, Memphis, Tennessee. The Vehicle Storage lot operates seven (7) days a week, 24 hours per day. Vehicle Storage processes vehicles that are brought to the facility by the authority of the Memphis Police Department (MPD), the Shelby County Sheriff's Department, or Housing and Community Development (HCD).



# TRAFFIC

## DUI

The DUI Unit responds to calls in the city involving alcohol or related crashes. DUI Officers are trained to investigate drivers suspected of being influenced by alcohol or other substances.

## PST

Police Service Technician (PST) is an entry-level position in the Memphis Police Department. PST's primarily handle crash investigations, issue non-moving traffic citations, recover stolen vehicles, and act as support personnel. They do not carry weapons or respond to crime scenes unless called in a traffic enforcement capacity.

## MOTORS

Motors primary function is the enforcement of traffic laws, assist in investigation of critical crash scenes, investigate minor crash scenes, assist with Special Events, and Dignitary Escorts. Motors have served in unique roles for security and crowd control for special assignments for Hollywood productions such as 21 Grams, Hustle and Flow, Black Snake Moan, and My Blueberry Nights.

## STIS

Special Traffic Investigation Squad is responsible for investigating crashes involving fatal or critical injuries. STIS conducts investigative functions by serving to assist MPD bureaus when called up and relentless investigations of Hit and Run suspects. STIS also investigate the crashes of elderly over the age of 85.

# SPECIAL SERVICES

**The Memphis Police Department provides specialized police services through Special Operations. The services are not only utilized by the Memphis Police Department but also regional law enforcement agencies.**

## **Air Support**

The Air Support Division is often utilized by MPD units and out-side agencies in various types of operations. Helicopters flown by Air Support include three Bell Jet Ranger helicopters and a Eurocopter A-Star helicopter. Staffed 16 hours a day, this high flying unit handled 553 calls for service in 2021 and was instrumental in 133 arrests.

## **Bomb Unit**

The Bomb Unit responded to 19 call outs in 2021. The Bomb Unit also participated in 16 security surveys, 3 arrests, and 25 training events.

## **Canine Unit**

This unit utilizes highly trained dogs who, along with their handlers, make up a unique team responsible for building searches and suspect searches, as well as narcotic and explosive detection. In 2021, the Canine Unit answered 4,146 calls, initiated 11,584 specials, and made 282 arrests.

## **Harbor Patrol**

This unit is responsible for the safety and enforcement of marine activities along the Mississippi River. The unit has three vessels in its fleet and officers assigned to the unit are responsible for ensuring daily that the vessels are ready to put into service. During 2021, the officers assigned to the Harbor Patrol handled 7 calls, 2 searches, 2 boat checks; handled, 1 boat assist, and 905 specials.

## **Homeland Security**

The Homeland Security Unit conducted 46 monthly meetings, 21 training sessions, 78 MPD Bureau Requests, 60 Outside Agency Requests, 72 potential threats, 14 suspicious activity calls, and 6 incidents of significance.



# SPECIAL SERVICES

## Mounted Patrol

The Mounted Patrol Unit began 2021 with a total compliment of (7) officers. This number included (1) Lieutenant, (1) Sergeant, (5) Patrolman, and (1) Reserve Patrolman. Additional trained officers are: (2) additional auxiliary officers. As a unit, the Mounted Patrol officers and their 10 mounts handled 20 calls, 110 community details, worked 95 patrol assignments, attended 55 training sessions and initiated 2,549 specials.

## Reserve Officers

The Memphis Police Reserve Division was formed in 1968 due to the critical shortage of law enforcement manpower; budget restrictions and a need to help hold back the surge of crime inflicted upon the citizens of this community. Reserve Officers are still upholding the proud tradition of service to our community. The total number of 188 reserves worked 15,190 total hours for the year 2021.

## Tact Unit

This elite unit, specially trained to respond to various emergency situations, is responsible for handling barricade situations, hostage rescues, counter-terrorism, and high risk felony apprehensions. Although not subject to regular calls for service like patrol units, the Tact Unit responded to 39 radio calls, initiated 827 specials, made 4 arrests, issued 77 tickets, and handled 4 barricade/hostage situations in 2021. The TACT Unit also participated in 6 VIP Security Details and 1 gun seizure.



# TRAINING ACADEMY

**The Memphis Police Academy provides training programs that vary from civilian training to basic and in-service training for commissioned officers. Basic recruit training consists of 840 hours of training that focuses on the enhancement of knowledge, skills, and proficiency in firearms, tactical and behavioral law enforcement theories necessary for the appointment to a commissioned status.**

## **Recruiting and Administrative**

- 96: Total of graduated MPD Police Recruits for 2021(Basic/ Lateral).
- 16: Total of graduated MPD Police Service Technicians for 2021.
- 36: Total of graduated Regional Recruits for 2021.
- 121 probationary officers monitored by FTO Coordinators office.
- The Recruiting Team continued the “Best in Blue” recruitment efforts and accepted 2,913 police applicants from January 1, 2021 to December 31, 2021.
- Academy Litigation Team assisted the City Attorney’s Office and Memphis Police Department Legal Advisor’s Office in 37 litigation cases.
- Commendation Committee reviewed individual cases (TOP COP included) for awards that would be given at the commendations ceremony in 2021.
- Commendation Staff reviewed recommendations that would be issued at workstation roll calls.
- The MPD Training Academy is nationally accredited by the Commission on Accreditation for Law Enforcement Agencies (CALEA).

## **Training**

- 725 officers attended Specialized Training.
- 1,854 officers completed In-service Training.
- Provided In-Service Training to Memphis Police Officers and Outside Agency Officers.
- Maintained and provided an in-house legal expert to enhance training in criminal law.

# TRAINING ACADEMY

## Employment Unit

- A new Recruiting plan was developed and implemented to attract highly qualified prospects to become Public Safety Officers.
- The Recruiting Team continued the “Best in Blue” recruitment efforts to expand its reach and procurement of qualified candidates to apply and join the Memphis Police Department as Law Enforcement Officers. The employment unit accepted 2,913 police applicants from January 1, 2021 to December 31, 2021.
- The Recruiting Team utilized social media and its website to market and disseminate recruitment advertising information.
- The Recruiting Team attended 161 recruiting events, which included 31 Military Hiring Events; 27 Jobs/Career Fairs; 21 Community/Career Day Events; 52 High School visits; 10 Media Interviews; and increased the number of viable applicants. The Recruiting Team made personable contact with more than 6,033 persons of interest.
- Recruiting flyers were posted in Churches, Colleges/ Universities, Military Bases, and Civic Organizations – locally and regionally.
- Recruitment interviews were conducted on local television and radio stations.
- The Background Investigation team accepted and processed a combined total of 2,913 various applications and records requests, 54 of which background investigations – for employment consideration – were investigated and completed.
- The Standard Operating Procedures (SOP) and the Background Investigation Training (BIT) manual were updated to reflect employment guidelines and procedures.

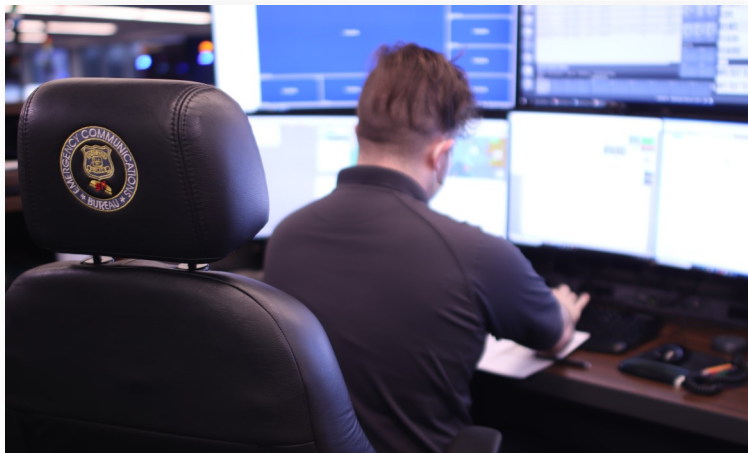

# INFORMATION SYSTEMS

## **Mission Statement**

The mission of MPD's Information Technology Division is to optimize the Department's ability to protect and serve the citizens of Memphis through the efficient and innovative use of the most advanced Information Technology (IT) available. Challenges include identifying which technologies should be incorporated to achieve the greatest public safety benefit. Responsibilities include planning, developing, implementing, and supporting the IT systems and networks throughout the Police Division.

Law enforcement requires timely and secure access to services that provide data whenever and wherever for deterring and reducing crime. The exchange of criminal justice information is governed by 28 C.F.R., part 20. The MPD Information Technology Division is responsible for this agency's compliance to the CJIS Security Policy and the Management Control Agreement.

## **2021 Accomplishments**

- Installed 57 in-dash ICV builds for new fleet, increasing the total number of ICV systems installed to 779 vehicles.
- Completed issuance of the Body III body worn camera to all precincts and specialized units.
- Hired 1 full-time Database Administrator.
- The RTCC Tele-serve unit has taken 4,922 telephonic reports saving uniform patrol over 4,000-man hours.
- Continued progress towards replacement of the citywide Radio System to Motorola.
- Citizen online reporting (DORs) has been purchased and is in the final stages of review prior to release.
- In process to consolidate body-worn cameras (BWCs) and in-car video (ICV) under one vendor; thereby, simplifying the capture and classification of video and the evidentiary process. As part of the amended contract, successfully negotiated for interview rooms and drones to be added as part of the enterprise solution.
- Awarded \$250,000 Justice Administration Grant (JAG) which allowed for the purchase and placement of forty-two (42) License Plate Readers (LPRs) to be placed in areas of high crime concentration.
- Contract executed for the grant funded Gun Shot Recognition System to be deployed as part of Strategic Policing Initiative (SPI). Working towards go-live date of April 1, 2021.

## CRIME PREVENTION

The Crime Prevention Unit was implemented in 2011 to create, organize, coordinate and manage all community- oriented and community outreach initiatives affiliated with the Memphis Police Department. The unit's largest program is the Community Outreach Program (C.O.P.).

This initiative was developed utilizing the existing manpower from the former police Co-Act units. Its restructuring better serves the community relative to community policing and the reduction of juvenile violence.

Implemented March 10, 2012, the C.O.P. Unit consists of approximately 60 officers and six (6) supervisors who are assigned designated target areas. These areas were identified from collected crime data with the assistance of the University of Memphis. These officers address crime issues and community problems in the target areas through a three prong approach.

Officers identify issues and problems by talking to citizens, completing surveys and reviewing crime data. After the appropriate enforcement is applied, prevention education is provided with the aid of community partners.



# ORGANIZED CRIME UNIT

The Organized Crime Unit of the Memphis Police Department is assigned the primary responsibility for investigative and control of organized crime, vice, and narcotics related offenses within the Department's jurisdiction. The Unit is multi-faceted and actively participates in multi-jurisdictional task forces to coordinate the attack on illegal activities at the local, state, and federal levels.
