INSPECTIONAL SERVICES

Inspectional Services is made up of the Internal Affairs Squad and the Security Squad. Inspectional Services conducts all internal investigations involving police personnel, as well as, other sensitive investigations. Officers assigned to these units are appointed by the Director of Police and are considered to be highly experienced investigators. In 1996, the offices of Internal Affairs and Security Squad were relocated to the 100 North Main building, Suite 2220, in downtown Memphis. In December of 2006, IAB and Security Squad were moved once again to the corner of Poplar and Union Extended.

PURPOSE OF INTERNAL AFFAIRS

The purpose of the Internal Affairs Squad is to define responsibilities and establish procedures for sworn members of this department for dealing with observed or reported allegations of misconduct. Internal Affairs investigates all complaints lodged against police personnel. These complaints can range from verbal abuse to brutality. The majority of these complaints fall under three categories: Personal Conduct, Use of Force and Arrest, and Duty Performance.

PURPOSE OF SECURITY SQUAD

The Security Squad investigates all shooting incidents involving police officers and any complaints regarding possible criminal misconduct against employees. These investigations include accusations against officers, city employees from various departments, and other administrative investigations. The Security Squad is also responsible for teaching Deadly Force lectures at the Training Academy for new police recruits and during In-Service Training for veteran officers. Their Deadly Force lecture is also part of the training received by all citizens enrolled in the Citizen's Police Academy.

INVESTIGATIVE SERVICES

The Investigative Services branch of the Memphis Police Department is responsible for thoroughly reviewing the details surrounding every crime committed in Memphis. Investigative Services work closely with all branches of the Memphis Police Department and other law enforcement agencies to solve crime.

CRIME SCENE INVESTIGATION

The Crime Scene Investigation Unit is a full-time operational unit responsible for conducting on-site investigations at the scenes of violent crimes (homicides, sex crimes, robberies, aggravated assaults, and missing persons), and property crimes (burglaries, auto thefts, and thefts or destruction of property over \$10,000). CSI also handles any follow-up investigative requests for which CSI services are needed to process, collect, preserve, package, transport, analyze, and document physical and/or trace evidence that will assist in the successful investigation and prosecution of offenders committing crimes in Memphis. CSI is a support unit to all bureaus within Investigative Services and provides training to regional law enforcement personnel in the area of crime scene investigations.

For the year 2023, the most significant accomplishment for the Latent Print Office was the feat of completing 5,671 latent cases despite the many obstacles that were faced while being understaffed. This was accomplished by the latent print examiners utilizing their skills while upholding the professionalism the Department has come to expect. A major result of these efforts were the 2,507 individual finger and palm print identifications (hits) that were made. These identifications were made available to investigators Department wide, adding solvability to numerous cases. These identifications also provided valuable assistance to the local, state, and federal courts in the prosecution of the diverse and complex cases they handled. The Latent Print Unit's expertise was called upon by various outside agencies to render opinions, evaluations, and examinations of cases they could not find elsewhere.

DOMESTIC VIOLENCE

The Domestic Violence Unit (DV) is responsible for investigating incidents involving domestic violence. The DV Unit works closely with the Citizen's Dispute Office and the Shelby County Sheriff's Office regarding Domestic Violence warrants and protective orders. In 2023, the DV Unit reviewed 15,737 cases which included 2,039 aggravated assaults and 7,064 simple assaults.

ECONOMIC CRIMES

The Economic Crimes Bureau is responsible for the investigation and prosecution of individuals involved in felony crimes. Crimes investigated include forgeries, counterfeit checks, counterfeit credit and debit cards, computer fraud, insurance fraud, and various other forms of financial institution fraud. In 2023, Economic Crime Investigators handled 4,659 cases, made 297 total arrests and had a 16.89% clearance rate.

FELONY RESPONSE

Felony Response handles preliminary investigations of all types of crime classifications. Offenses investigated include: rape, homicide, robbery, burglary, and larceny. In 2023, Felony Response handled 4,836 calls, 2,741 investigations, and 2,418 arrests.

HOMICIDE

The Homicide Bureau is responsible for conducting all investigations related to homicides, suicides, and natural or accidental deaths. The Homicide Bureau investigated 399 total homicides; 342 classified as criminal homicides and 38 justifiable homicides. The Homicide Bureau also handled 3,752 total cases, which included: suicides, natural deaths, attempt suicides, and unknown deaths. Investigators solved 200 homicides and solved 10 cases from previous years bringing the clearance rate to 50%, placing the bureau's clearance rate at 2% below the national average of a little above 52.3% reported by the Federal Bureau of Investigation's (FBI) for 2022.

MISSING PERSONS

The Missing Persons Bureau is responsible for conducting investigations into the disappearance of all adults and juveniles. This includes all non-criminal adult missing persons, missing juveniles, juvenile runaways, and children who are victims of Custodial Interference which may result in criminal charges. In 2023, Missing Persons Bureau investigated 4,715 total Missing Persons Cases. In that number of cases there were 1442 Missing Persons Cases, 2102

Runaways Cases, 402 Custodial Interferences Cases, and 769 Memos or Miscellaneous Cases. Investigators were able to clear 3,256 Missing Persons Cases. Giving the unit an 69.06% clearance rate.

PAWN/SCRAP/SEIZURE

Pawn, Scrap, Seizure Unit investigates person(s) responsible for thefts of scrap metals, monitor and identify frequent pawners, recovers stolen property, assist outside agencies, and assist investigators in creating a deterrent for criminals by seizing vehicles that were used conveyance of felony crimes. Pawn, Scrap, Seizure Unit handled 138 assigned scrap cases, 133 pawn pickups, 792 items seized at value of \$122,918, and made 9 arrests during 2023.

PROPERTY AND EVIDENCE

Memphis Police Department Property and Evidence is operated 24 hours daily. Property and Evidence is responsible for logging and storing thousands of pieces of property that come into the possession of UAPD each year. Property may be classified as evidence connected with case investigations, search warrants, or seized as contraband. In 2023, the unit issued 26,748 evidence numbers, tagged 108,661 items, and released 7,152 items to authorized persons.

QUALITY ASSURANCE UNIT

The mission of the Quality Assurance Unit is to effectively review and properly classify memos, review unfounded and exceptionally cleared incidents, and assist bureaus with report validation. They also ensure that The Memphis Police Department is properly reporting incidents under TIBRS and NIBRS standards. The Quality Assurance Unit reviewed, verified, and or corrected 23,315 TIBRS errors in 2023.

SEX CRIMES/JUVENILE ABUSE

This unit is responsible for handling investigations involving any

sexual or physically abusive crime. In 2023, the Sex Crimes/Juvenile Abuse Squad reviewed 1,419 total cases which included 296 rapes, 150 occurrences of forcible fondling, and 135 stalking complaints.

VEHICLE STORAGE

The City of Memphis Vehicle Storage is located at 465 Klinke Avenue, Memphis, Tennessee. The Vehicle Storage lot operates seven (7) days a week, 24 hours per day. Vehicle Storage processes vehicles that are brought to the facility by the authority of the Memphis Police Department (MPD), the Shelby County Sheriff's Department, or Housing and Community Development (HCD).

VIOLENT CRIMES UNIT

The Violent Crimes Unit will work within the jurisdiction of the City of Memphis to conduct investigations relative to the following carjacking offenses, robbery-individual with vehicle taken offenses, interstate shooting offenses, serial crimes involving acts of violence, and any investigation at the request of the MPD Command Staff. The Violent Crimes Unit investigated 788 cases resulting in 389 physical arrests consisting of 405 felony charges and 93 warrants issued. The Violent Crimes Unit clearing 170 of 371 Carjackings for a 46.00% clearance rate, 104 of 227 Robbery-Individual with Vehicle Taken for a 46.00% clearance rate, 11 of 102 Interstate Shootings for a 11.00% clearance rate, 7 of 8 Robbery/Individual for a 88.00% clearance rate, 3 of 5 Aggravated Assaults for a 60.00% clearance rate and 16 of 15 Drug/Weapon for a 94.00% clearance rate.



TRAFFIC DIVISION

DUI

DUI Unit responds to calls in the city involving alcohol or related crashes. DUI Officers are especially trained in the investigations of drivers suspected of being under the influence of alcohol or other substances.

PST

Police Service Technician (PST) is an entry level position of the Memphis Police Department. PSTs primarily handle crash investigations, issue non-moving traffic citations, recover stolen vehicles, and act as support personnel. They do not carry weapons or respond to crime scenes unless called to do so in a traffic enforcement capacity.

MOTORS

Motors primary function is the enforcement of traffic laws, assist in investigation of critical crash scenes, investigate minor crash scenes, assist with Special Events, and Dignitary Escorts. Motors have served in unique roles for security and crowd control for

special assignments for Hollywood productions such as 21 Grams, Hustle and Flow, Black Snake Moan, and My Blueberry Nights.

STIS

Special Traffic Investigation Squad is responsible for investigating crashes involving fatal or critical injuries. STIS conducts investigative functions by serving to assist MPD bureaus when called up and relentless investigations of Hit and Run suspects. STIS also investigate the crashes of elderly over the age of 85.

SPECIAL SERVICES

The Memphis Police Department provides specialized police services through Special Operations. The services are not only utilized by the Memphis Police Department but also regional law enforcement agencies.

AIR SUPPORT

The Air Support Division is often utilized by MPD units and outside agencies in various types of operations. In 2023, the Memphis Police Department's Air Support Unit responded to 915 service calls, conducted over 290 searches for missing persons, suspects, and vehicles, and assisted in the arrests of more than 265 individuals involved in serious felonies, including carjacking, homicide, and aggravated assault.

BOMB UNIT

The Bomb Unit responded to 71 callouts in 2023. The Bomb Unit also participated in 41 security surveys, 28 static displays, and 36 training events.

CANINE UNIT

This unit utilizes highly trained dogs who, along with their handlers, make up a unique team responsible for building searches and suspect searches, as well as narcotic and explosive detection. In 2023, the Canine Unit answered 3,609 calls, initiated 9,220 specials, and made 325 arrests.

HARBOR PATROL

This unit is responsible for the safety and enforcement of marine activities along the Mississippi River. The unit has three vessels in its fleet and officers assigned to the unit are responsible for ensuring daily that the vessels are ready to put into service. During 2023, the officers assigned to the Harbor Patrol handled 49 calls, 15 searches, 567 citations issued, handled 32 boat assist, and 1,791 specials.

MOUNTED PATROL

The Mounted Patrol Unit began 2023 with a total compliment of (6) officers. This number included (1) Lieutenant, (4) Patrolman, and (1) Reserve Patrolmen. As a unit, the Mounted Patrol officers and their 10 mounts handled 13 arrests, 298 citations, 86 community details, worked 158 patrol assignments, attended 119 training sessions and initiated 3,432 specials.

RESERVE OFFICERS

The Memphis Police Reserve Division was formed in 1968 due to the critical shortage of law enforcement manpower; budget restrictions and a need to help hold back the surge of crime inflicted upon the citizens of this community. Reserve Officers are still upholding the proud tradition of service to our community. The total number of 143 reserves worked 27,187 total hours for the year 2023.

TACT UNIT

This elite unit, specially trained to respond to various emergency situations, is responsible for handling barricade situations, hostage rescues, counter-terrorism, and high risk felony apprehensions. Although not subject to regular calls for service like patrol units, the Tact Unit responded to 40 radio calls, initiated 921 specials, made 12 arrests, issued 14 tickets, and handled 3 barricade/hostage situations in 2023. The TACT Unit also participated in 6 VIP Security Details, and 7 gun seizures.



TRAINING ACADEMY

The Memphis Police Academy provides training programs that vary from civilian training to basic and in-service training for commissioned officers. Basic recruit training consists of 940 hours of training. This training focuses on enhancing knowledge, skills, and proficiency in firearms, and tactical and behavioral law enforcement training necessary for the appointment to a commissioned peace officer in Tennessee.

EMPLOYMENT UNIT

- In 2023, the Employment Unit of the Memphis Police Department's Training Academy – a nationally recognized CALEA (Commission on Accreditation of Law Enforcement Agencies) Academy – coordinated recruitment, application processing, entry-level testing, and background investigations relative to the hiring of Memphis Police Recruits, Police Service Technicians and other agencies at the request of the Chief of Police or designee.

Working as a team, the unit successfully contributed to the hiring objectives and goals of the Memphis Police Department and the City of Memphis. As a result, the unit made great strides that led to outstanding accomplishments in 2023.

Accomplishments achieved include, but are not limited to the following, whereas:

- A new Recruiting plan was developed and implemented to attract qualified prospects to become Memphis Police Officers and Police Service Technicians.
- The Recruiting Team continued the "Join the Best in Blue" recruitment efforts to expand its reach and retention of qualified police recruit and police service technician candidates to join the Memphis Police Department.
- The Recruiting Team utilized social media, radio ads and interviews, billboards, television commercials, and The Memphis Police Department's website to market and disseminate recruitment information.
- The Recruiting Team attended 24 community events, 29 recruiting events, conducted approximately 15 radio recruiting interviews, and hosted four hiring expos at the Departments' headquarters.
- Recruiting flyers were posted in department stations, libraries, churches, colleges & universities, military bases, shopping malls, and civic organizations.
- 2,103 police recruit applications were submitted. 284 police service technician applications were submitted. The Background Investigation Team accepted and processed a combined total of 606 background investigations and records requests.
- The Standard Operating Procedures and the Background Investigation Training Manual were updated to reflect employment guidelines and procedures.
- The investigators received additional investigative training.
- A coordinator was assigned for the pre-hire program. The
